The Fijian Crested Iguana (*Brachylophus vitiensis*) is one of Fiji's most iconic species and is protected on the island of Yadua Tabu in Bua that became Fiji's first Wildlife Sanctuary in 1980 following the discovery of the species in 1979. Through a range of conservation actions in the past three decades, the island boasts the largest population of any iguana species in the world, some of the best remaining examples of the critically endangered Tropical Dry Forest, and a handful of native and endangered species.
